If you've been following the news, you are probably aware Nebraska State Senator Tom Briese is backing a Bill that would make DST our permanent time, thereby eliminating the need to adjust our internal clocks to "fall back" and "spring forward" twice a year. The Bill has cleared the first of three rounds of debate by a 47 to 3 count, but making the time change permanent is still far from a certainty at this point. I understand there are pro and cons to making such a move, but personally I don't like going to and leaving work in the dark!

On a more serious note, the United States just had its first FDIC insured bank closures in almost two and half years. In an effort to ease depositors' fears in all banks, the FDIC quickly stepped up and provided assurances that NO depositor of these failed banks would lose ANY of their deposits. That being said, it is important to note the failed banks are made up differently than Five Points Bank. Five Points Bank is a privately-held community bank, operating exclusively within the State of Nebraska. We are a well-diversified bank, taking care of farmers, commercial businesses, and consumers alike. Furthermore, our capital levels put us in the highest regulatory capital category there is and we are designated a 5-star rated bank (the highest rating given) by Bauer Financial, Inc.

## **Investing Road Map for Retirees**

Everyone has a unique retirement situation. That being said, the Five Points Financial Services Team ran across an article that has merit in offering some guidance in planning for retirement. The full article link in Morningstar is provided above. The following is a summary of that article provided by Jordan Reinertson.

Successful retirement plans adapt with the times. The "bucket" approach to investing within your portfolio can be a useful strategy. An individual's spending in years one and two of retirement above what social security, pensions, etc. can provide can go into safer, liquid investments like savings accounts, CDs and short-term bonds. Years three through eight can focus on

a wider range of investments including short-term bonds because they provide higher returns than cash but typically do not have as much downward risk as stocks. Retirement funds for later years can be invested in more volatile assets like stocks because greater growth prospects and the ability to whether downturns over a longer period are a reasonable tradeoff for the higher likelihood of outpacing inflation.

A person needs to continue to focus on living on less than he or she makes. A budget is just as important during retirement as it was during working years. Having an emergency fund is essential for a larger surprise medical bill, car or household repair. This rainy day fund combined with the right types of insurance help people manage their stress better.

But what types of insurance may a person might need in retirement? Long-term care insurance may be one. Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage, property and casualty, healthcare coverage to insure against higher out of pocket costs with supplemental insurance alongside Medicare might be another. Finally, retirees typically do not have as much need for life insurance anymore unless there are some unique estate planning objectives.

On the income side, remember to plot out guaranteed sources of income. A big key for most people will be social security. Some might have pensions as well. An additional area to consider could be to add an income annuity which also provides a guaranteed lifetime income.

Historically, a four percent guideline for withdrawals has been the potential target during the first year of retirement and adjusted for inflation afterwards. If a person has multiple accounts think about taking withdrawals from taxable accounts first. IRAs and 401(k)s are taxable upon withdrawing and subject to RMDs; therefore, be aware so as to not get bumped into the next tax bracket if possible. Think about withdrawing from the Roth account last because it is a tax free investment with no RMDs.

Overall, an individual needs to manage their spending behavior. Having the right kinds of insurance with an emergency fund can help give a sense of peace as he or she moves into their retirement years.

The best part of spring is that winter is behind us! I love the change in seasons, especially when the trees are starting to bud, my hostas are peaking through the ground and the weather warms up!


