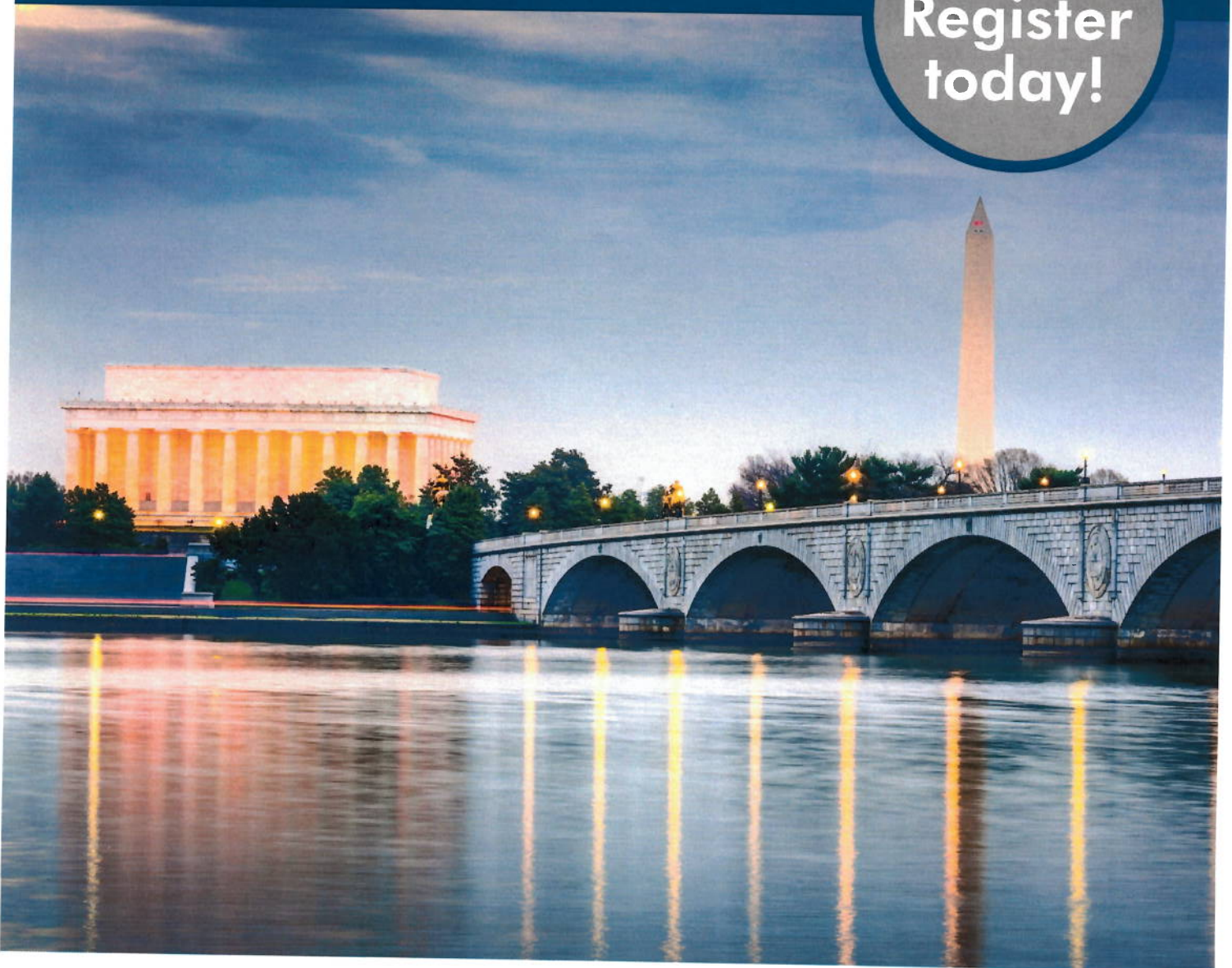


WASHINGTON, DC

DAY 1 TUESDAY, JUNE 18

CORALVILLE, IA

(Dinner)

Today we will depart from our designated pick-up locations in Kearney, Grand Island, Lincoln, and Omaha and begin our journey to the East Coast with stops for comfort and lunch on our own along the way. We'll travel as far as **Coralville, IA**, where our overnight accommodations at the **Hyatt Regency** (or similar) and a wonderful welcome dinner await.

DAY 2 WEDNESDAY, JUNE 19

SHIPSHEWANA, IN

(Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Enjoy breakfast this morning before we board our motorcoach and embark on the day's drive. Lunch will be enjoyed as a group en route. This evening we'll find ourselves in the heart of Indiana's Amish country for **dinner and a fantastic performance of Josiah for President at the Blue Gate Theatre** in **Shipshewana**. This entertaining musical follows Josiah Stoltzfus, a hard-working Amish farmer with old-fashioned common sense, as he unknowingly becomes a write-in candidate for president! After a fun-filled evening, our day will come to an end at the **Blue Gate Hotel** (or similar).

DAY 3 THURSDAY, JUNE 20

PITTSBURGH, PA

(Breakfast)

Following breakfast we will venture to a **local market** to browse the selection of meats, cheeses, candies, delectable baked goods, handmade artisan gifts, and more. Our journey will then continue across Ohio to **Pittsburgh, PA**. Pittsburgh is where Andrew Carnegie amassed most of his fortune in the steel industry and where he began what is known today as the Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh. Choose one of two of these museums to discover – the **Carnegie Museum of Art** or the **Carnegie Museum of Natural History**. The art museum is home to more than 100,000 pieces ranging from paintings and sculptures to drawings, photographs, and architectural casts, while the natural history museum is perfect for those interested in Earth's natural resources. Human culture, dinosaurs, reptiles, plants, mammals, minerals, and so much more are explored here! Dinner is on your own this evening before we overnight at the **Hilton Garden Inn Pittsburgh University Place** (or similar).

DAY 4 FRIDAY, JUNE 21

OWINGS MILLS, MD

(Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Our adventure today will take us into Pennsylvania's Laurel Highlands in the Allegheny Mountains. Here we will find Shanksville and the **Flight 93 National Memorial** commemorating those who lost their lives in the Flight 93 crash during the September 11th attacks. The memorial's ninety-three-foot-tall Tower of Voices with its forty wind chimes serves as a poignant reminder of the heroism of the forty passengers and crew aboard the flight. After paying our respects and enjoying a boxed lunch, it's time to get reacquainted with the details of the Civil War's most decisive battle through interactive exhibits and multimedia presentations at the **Gettysburg National Military Park's Visitor Center**. An impressive collection of guns, ammunition, uniforms, flags, and personal items of brave soldiers are on display here, and the thought-provoking film *A New Birth of Freedom* can't be missed! There's also the amazing Gettysburg Cyclorama, a 360-degree painting of Pickett's Charge that is longer than a football field and higher than a four-story building. A licensed battlefield guide will then join us on our motorcoach and take us to important landmarks and point out a few of the over 1,200 monuments and markers sprinkled throughout the battlefield. We'll round out the day with dinner together and an overnight at the **Hampton Inn Baltimore/Owings Mills** (or similar).

DAY 5 SATURDAY, JUNE 22

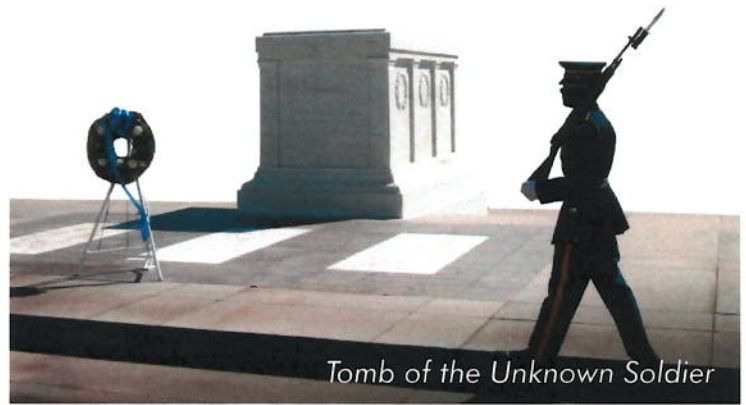
WASHINGTON, DC

(Breakfast, Lunch)

After breakfast we are off to **Fort McHenry**, where Francis Scott Key was inspired to write the national anthem during the Battle of Baltimore. It is one of only a handful of locations where the American flag is required to be flown at all times. We will join park staff as they change the flag and then have lunch at a local restaurant before venturing south to **Washington, DC**. Our touring will take us along **Embassy Row** where many of the District's 177 embassies are located, each with their country's flag flying out front. The **Royal Sonesta Washington DC Dupont Circle** (or similar) is our home for the next three nights, and the evening is yours to explore the neighborhood and grab dinner on your own.

DAY 6 SUNDAY, JUNE 23

WASHINGTON, DC

(Breakfast)

We will begin our first full day in our nation's capital with breakfast followed by a tour of the major memorials, including the **Washington Monument**; the **Jefferson and FDR memorials**; and the especially poignant **Vietnam, Korean, and Lincoln memorials**. Then enjoy some free time to explore the area and world-class Smithsonian museums on your own. Whether your interest is early American history, natural history, art, or space exploration, you will find an amazing collection of artifacts! The National Museum of American History reflects the experience of the American people and houses items such as the original Star Spangled Banner, Lincoln's top hat, and Dorothy's slippers from *The Wizard of Oz*. The National Museum of Natural History offers an up-close look at rare gemstones, fossilized dinosaurs, and many more exhibits related to our natural world. The National Air and Space Museum traces the history of American aviation from the Wright brothers' plane and Lindbergh's *Spirit of St. Louis* to the Apollo 11 Lunar Excursion Module (*subject to timed-entry pass availability*). And the National Museum of African American History & Culture tells the story of America through the eyes of African Americans. The National Museum of the American Indian, the National Museum of African Art, and the National Museum of Asian Art are also in the area! Dinner is on your own this evening.

DAY 7 MONDAY, JUNE 24

WASHINGTON, DC

(Breakfast, Dinner)

Up first today is the **United States Holocaust Memorial Museum**, dedicated to educating visitors on the horrors of the Holocaust, remembering the survivors and victims, and confronting the same evils today (*subject to timed-entry pass availability*). We'll explore the events that brought Hitler to power and set in motion his plan to rid Europe of Jews, come face to face with life in the ghettos and concentration camps through survivor testimonies and precious artifacts, and learn about the liberation of the camps and the aftermath of the Holocaust. Then we are off to **Arlington National Cemetery**. Nearly 400,000 people are buried in these hallowed grounds, ranging from presidents, military heroes, and Supreme Court justices to astronauts, entertainers, and members of Congress. Here we'll board the Tourmobile and pay our respects at the Kennedy gravesite and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. After this poignant experience, our group will enjoy dinner together at a local restaurant.

DAY 8 TUESDAY, JUNE 25

COLUMBUS, OH

(Breakfast, Lunch)

We'll say goodbye to Washington, DC, this morning as we begin our journey back west. Say hello again to the Allegheny Mountains as we venture through the West Virginia countryside with a stop at **Blackwater Falls State Park**. This fifty-seven-foot cascade is named for its waters tinted by tannic acids and is one of the state's most photographed spots. A boxed lunch will be provided as we continue on toward **Columbus, OH**, and our overnight accommodations at the **Drury Inn & Suites Columbus Grove City** (*or similar*). The remainder of the day is yours to relax and have dinner on your own at a nearby restaurant.

DAY 9 WEDNESDAY, JUNE 26

BETTENDORF, IA

(Breakfast, Dinner)

Fuel up for the day with our hotel's breakfast before we board the motorcoach for the day's drive. Our first stop will be in Dayton at the **National Museum of the United States Air Force** to explore the countless exhibits on military aviation history. More than 350 aerospace vehicles and thousands of historical items bring the story of military air power to life, from the Wright Brothers to the stealth and precision technologies of today. Walk aboard presidential planes, see one of the best collections of WWII aircraft, and get an up-close look at missiles and spacecraft! The day's drive will come to an end in **Bettendorf, IA**, at the **Cambria Hotel Davenport Quad Cities** (*or similar*). Tonight's farewell dinner along the banks of the Mississippi River will be the perfect way to cap off our fantastic journey to the East Coast and our nation's capital.

DAY 10 THURSDAY, JUNE 27

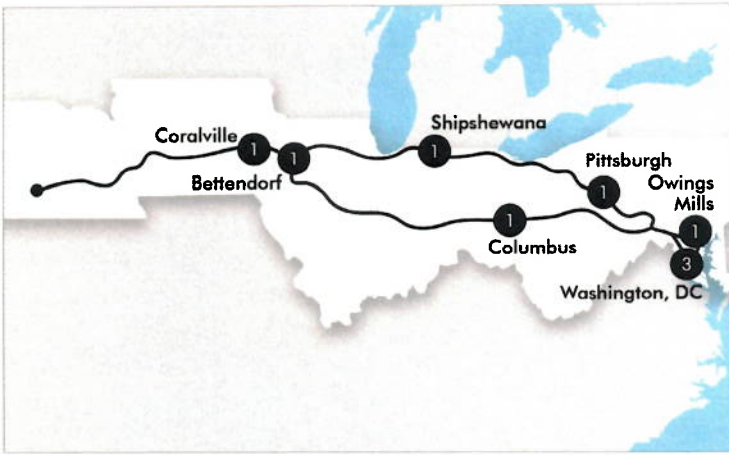
